Dear Mr. President:

Pursuant to Section 641 of Public Law 108-447, the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2005, which sets forth the annual reporting requirements for the *Buy American Act* and which requires each Federal agency to submit a report to Congress on the amount of acquisitions made annually from entities that manufacture articles, materials, or supplies outside of the United States in that fiscal year, the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) provides the following information for FY 2008:

- 1. Provide the dollar value of any articles, materials, or supplies purchased that were manufactured outside of the United States.**
