We have carefully investigated and considered your charge that **United Professional and Service Employees Union**, Local 1222 has violated the National Labor Relations Act.

Decision to Dismiss: Your charge alleges that since about (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 2016, the Union refused to process your grievance over your termination for arbitrary or discriminatory reasons or in bad faith.

The investigation revealed insufficient evidence to find that the Union breached its obligation to fairly represent you regarding your grievance. Rather, the evidence showed that the Union filed a grievance over your termination and was successful in reaching a resolution with the Employer that resulted in your reinstatement.

Based on these facts and the absence of any evidence of unlawful motive in the Union's handling of your grievance, I am dismissing your charge.

Your Right to Appeal: You may appeal my decision to the General Counsel of the National Labor Relations Board, through the Office of Appeals.

Means of Filing: An appeal may be filed electronically, by mail, by delivery service, or hand-delivered. To file electronically using the Agency's e-filing system, go to our website at www.nlrb.gov and:
